The citations below are intended as basic examples of how to cite commonly used resources. For more detailed information, consult the 6<sup>th</sup> edition of Gibaldi's MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers. ### **Scholarly Journal Article (print or microform)** MLA Handbook pp. 180-84

Author's Last name, First name. "Title of Article." Title of Journal Volume<sup>1</sup> (year): pages.

### **Scholarly Journal Article (retrieved from library database)** MLA Handbook pp. 229-30

Author's Last name, First name. "Title of Article." Title of Journal Volume (year): pages<sup>2</sup>. Name of database. Name of Library. Date accessed<sup>3</sup> <URL of the database's main page>.

### **Scholarly Journal Article (retrieved from free website)** MLA Handbook pp. 221-23

Author's Last name, First name. "Title of Article." Title of Journal Volume (year): pages/ sections/paragraphs<sup>4</sup>. Date accessed<sup>3</sup> <URL<sup>5</sup>>.

### **Book** MLA Handbook pp. 147-52

Author's Last name, First name. Title of Book. City: Publisher, year.

### **WebSite** MLA Handbook pp. 207-18

Author's Last name, First name. "Title of Page/Document." Title of Website. Date page last updated<sup>6</sup>.  
Name of Organization Responsible for the Website (of any). Date accessed<sup>3</sup> <URL<sup>5</sup>>.

### **Website - No Author** MLA Handbook pp. 207-18

"Title of Document." Title of Website (if any). Date page last updated<sup>6</sup>. Name of site editor (if any).  
Name of Organization Responsible for the Content (if any). Date accessed<sup>3</sup> <URL<sup>5</sup>>.

<sup>1</sup> If the page numbers restart with #1 in each issue of the journal, include a period and the issue number after the volume number (e.g. volume 7, issue number 3 would be represented by 7.3).

<sup>2</sup> If the database does not list the entire page range, include the first page number followed by a dash.

<sup>3</sup> Date the writer (you) accessed the article or page in the format Day Month Year (e.g. 9 May 2004).

<sup>4</sup> Include total number of pages, sections or paragraphs if numbered on the website.

<sup>5</sup> If the URL of the article or document itself is overly long or not static, use the URL of the site's search or main page instead.

<sup>6</sup> Date the page was last updated in the format Day Month Year (e.g. 9 November 2004).

## **Personal Home Page** MLA Handbook p. 218

Author's Last name, First name. Home page. Date last updated<sup>7</sup>. Date accessed<sup>8</sup> <URL>.

## **Document from a Reproduction Service (like ERIC Microfiche)** MLA Handbook p. 193

Author's Last name, First name. Title of Work. City: Publisher, year. Name of reproduction service and accession number.

## **Master's Thesis** MLA Handbook p. 179

Author's Last name, First name. "Title of Thesis." MA (or MS) thesis, Name of University, Location, year.

## **Magazine or Newspaper Article (print or microform)** MLA Handbook pp. 187-88

Author's Last name, First name. "Title of Article." Title of Magazine/Newspaper Day<sup>9</sup> Month Year: pages.

## **Magazine or Newspaper Article (retrieved from library database)** MLA Handbook pp. 229-30

Author's Last name, First name. "Title of Article." Title of Magazine/Newspaper Day<sup>6</sup> Month Year (of publication): pages<sup>10</sup>. Name of database. Name of Library. Date accessed<sup>8</sup> <URL of database main page>.

## **Magazine or Newspaper Article (retrieved from free website)** MLA Handbook pp. 221-23

Author's Last name, First name. "Title of Article." Title of Magazine/Newspaper Day<sup>6</sup> Month Year: pages/sections/paragraphs<sup>11</sup>. Date accessed<sup>8</sup> <URL<sup>12</sup>>.

<sup>7</sup> Date page last updated in the format Day Month Year (e.g. 9 November 2004).

<sup>8</sup> Date the writer (you) accessed the page in the format Day Month Year (e.g. 5 April 2004).

<sup>9</sup> Monthly magazines only require the month and year (e.g. May 2004).

<sup>10</sup> If the database does not list the entire page range, include the first page number followed by a dash.

<sup>11</sup> Include total number of pages, sections or paragraphs if numbered on the website.

<sup>12</sup> If the URL of the article or document itself is overly long or not static, use the URL of the site's search or main page instead.
